ADDITIONAL PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT FOR ROMA

PERFORMERS	individual teachers in parallel with teaching and Roma assistants
INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM for an individual pupil	at the beginning of a school year a teacher prepares and coordinates implementation with other participants
TEACHING METHODS	explanation, projection or display, working with images, photos and maps, interviews, observation, perception, sensation, evaluation
FORMS OF WORK	individual, pair or group work in/out of the classroom



PARENTS COOPERATION

-the execution of a **PTA meeting** inside the Roma settlement



- -regular visits of a social worker and Roma assisstants at home for easier communication and informing about any peculiarities
- -home visits by the teachers in the event of prolonged absence and providing information about the child's progress and work
- invitations to school events and activities organized for parents and pupils by the school



ADAPTED READING BEDGE for Roma pupils

important for raising reading literacy

An alternative for pupils with specific deficits that can not follow the regular program of reading badges

in addition to reading, the accompanying activities (reciting, dramatization, memorizing, illustration ...)

a range of Slovenian and Romani literary works, adapted to age groups
